
The problem



- On the way to having a fully-fledged circular economy
- Government and the sector working well together

What's coming up

April and May 2021 Consultation on the first changes to the Building Code

May 2021

Consultation on the updated frameworks

November 2021

First changes to the Building Code come into effect

What else is happening

This will be a landmark year for climate change policy:

- Carbon Neutral Government Programme underway
- First emissions budgets being developed by the CCC
- Final Emissions Reduction Plan published by the end of the year
